Warrior's Maloney, Vest Blank Karlsruhe Twice

Forty runs were scored by the Wiesbaden Warriors in their three-game series against the Karlsruhe Crusaders over the weekend while the visiting nine were able to eke out only a meager seven runs.

In the double header Saturday the Warriors won 20-0 and 9-7 and then came back Sunday and trounced the Crusaders 11-0.

On the mound for the Warriors in the first game of the double header Saturday was Jim Maloney and he chalked up his second win of the season with a one-hit, 12 strikeout affair.

The Warrior's iced Saturday's five-inning opener with an 11 run third inning in which the first 11 batters reached base safely.

In the nightcap, Maloney banged out three base hits while Chuck Sharp and Ron Burgess shared the pitching honors to give the Warriors the victory. Sid Vest, however, was needed in the last inning. He faced one batter and struck him out to end the contest.

Warrior batsmen backed Vest's brilliant performance with a well balanced nine hit attack led by Maloney, who collected a single and a double in five trips to the plate. They gave Vest all the runs he needed in the third inning when Maloney was safe on an error, Vest doubled him home, and Sharpe followed with a long single which scored Vest and Mike O'Brien, who had reached base via interference by the catcher.

These three victories boost the Warrior's won-loss record to 5-0. Their next action is scheduled for Berlin on June 13.
